# Weatherization Assistance Program

## What Is Weatherization?

Weatherization is the process by which homes are made more energy efficient. This result is accomplished through a series of relatively easy energy conservation measures. Homes that have been weatherized require less energy to heat and cool, resulting in lower utility bills and a higher standard of living.

The CSRA Economic Opportunity Authority Inc., uses the Whole House approach, which treats the house as a single energy-consuming system, rather than as a loose collection of unrelated pieces of equipment. Whole House Weatherization requires advanced diagnostic skills and cost-effective measure selection and installation.

By expanding the scope of the Program to adopt a whole-house approach and incorporating advanced energy efficiency technologies, it is anticipated that weatherization can achieve significantly greater energy savings; further reduce emissions of air pollutants and greenhouse gases; increase the leveraging potential of the weatherization network; and expand the Program's contribution to the economic health and sustainability of the nation's communities.



## How to Apply for Weatherization:



Diagnostic tools, like the blower door shown here, are used in weatherization to identify areas of air infiltration.

**Step One:** You may download an application at our website [www.csraeo.org](http://www.csraeo.org) or call our office at (706) 945-1616

**Step Two:** If you qualify, a Weatherization Quality Control Inspector will conduct an energy audit on your home. Diagnostic equipment is used to identify air filtration, pressure imbalances, and areas of air loss. Inspectors also evaluate energy-related health and safety conditions.

**Step Three:** After acceptance into the program and initial evaluations, weatherization contractors will install the most cost-effective energy efficiency measures.

- **Air Sealing**
- **Insulation of attics, floors, sidewalls**
- **Weather stripping**
- **Installing door sweeps**
- **Inspection of exhaust fans, return vents**
- **Hard wiring of CO/Smoke Detector Combos**
- **Conversion to energy efficient light bulbs**
